

CLUB TRIPS 2015

FEBRUARY:

WHANGANUI RIVER

Another great trip to the jewel of North Island Rivers. This location never disappoints

MARCH 29th:

NO TRIP PLANNED

APRIL 18th:

ONGARUE with TIM RICH

A Little Gem set in the Northern King Country. The Middle reaches are a stark contrast to the slow brown lower reaches that collide with the Whanganui. Tim is an expert in this area and you will learn plenty.

MAY 16th:

LAKE OTOMANGAKAU

The "Big O". A legendary destination which can be both challenging and satisfying and home to some big Rainbows and Browns. If you have a boat this is the trip for you. I have also arranged for loan boats and float tubes but there is plenty of shore based fishing as well. This lake close on May 31st so the fishing will be hot!!

JUNE 20th:

NGONGOTAHA STREAM

A small stream that holds big fish. The accommodation at Paradise Valley is excellent and river access is from the property. This is the first visit here for a couple of years and will be enjoyed by all. Bring a full fly box as there are snags a plenty

JULY 18th:

WAITAHANUI

Famous for the "Picket Fence" because of the line-up of anglers at the river mouth when the big runs are going through, this is a beautiful river that holds a lot of fish during the winter months.

AUGUST 15th:

LAKE ANIWHENUA

One of my favourites. Yes there is some weed but there is also plenty of fish. Small boats and float tubes can be used effectively but there is also plenty of shore based fishing and at this time of year, the weed has died back quite a bit.

SEPTEMBER 19TH:

TONGARIRO RIVER/TAURANGA TAUPO

This will be decided closer to the time but we will be fishing one of these two world famous rivers. This is the perfect time of the year to enjoy the spawning runs from Lake Taupo

OCTOBER 17th:

OHINEMURI

Right on our doorstep and open all year round this is a great spot for all comers.

NOVEMBER 21st

WAIIOEKA

Another big river with plenty of fish. Last year's trip was a great success so we will have a repeat performance

DECEMBER 12th

PUNIU

Can be a one day or two trip depending on interest. This is an area that needs exploring as most members seem to stay around the "Hilton" area but there is a lot more to this river and it is worth the effort.
